





HIV/AIDS research volunteers needed!

As you may or may not know, I have been working as an HIV/AIDS Case Manager for almost two years now, and it was my job that got me interested in AIDS research. As part of my graduate work in Penn State University's Masters in Applied Psychology program, I have to complete a research study, and what better area to study than HIV/AIDS. There is plenty of research out there on the medical aspects of the disease although more is still needed and always welcome, but I chose a much less studied area for my research project. I am focusing on pain, depression, and how the two conditions interact in individuals living with HIV. Both pain, depression, and mental health in general are vastly under-researched and under-treated in this population, and my hopes are to bring these two issues to light and hopefully have treatment for these disorders become part of the protocol for the care of people with HIV/AIDS.




