And so, we present to you the promise of Tomorrow in the 1967 **Dardanian**.







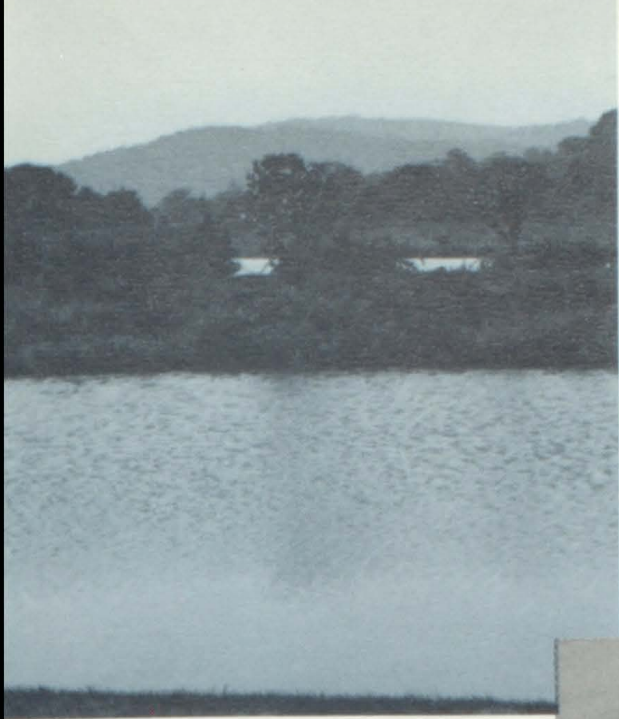

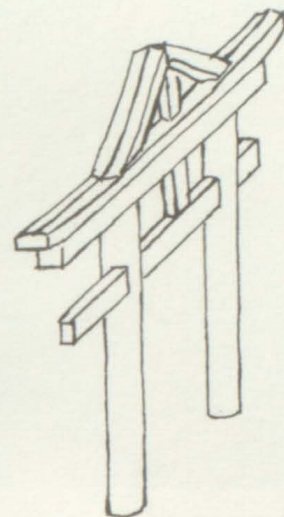
# DAIICHI DANSU

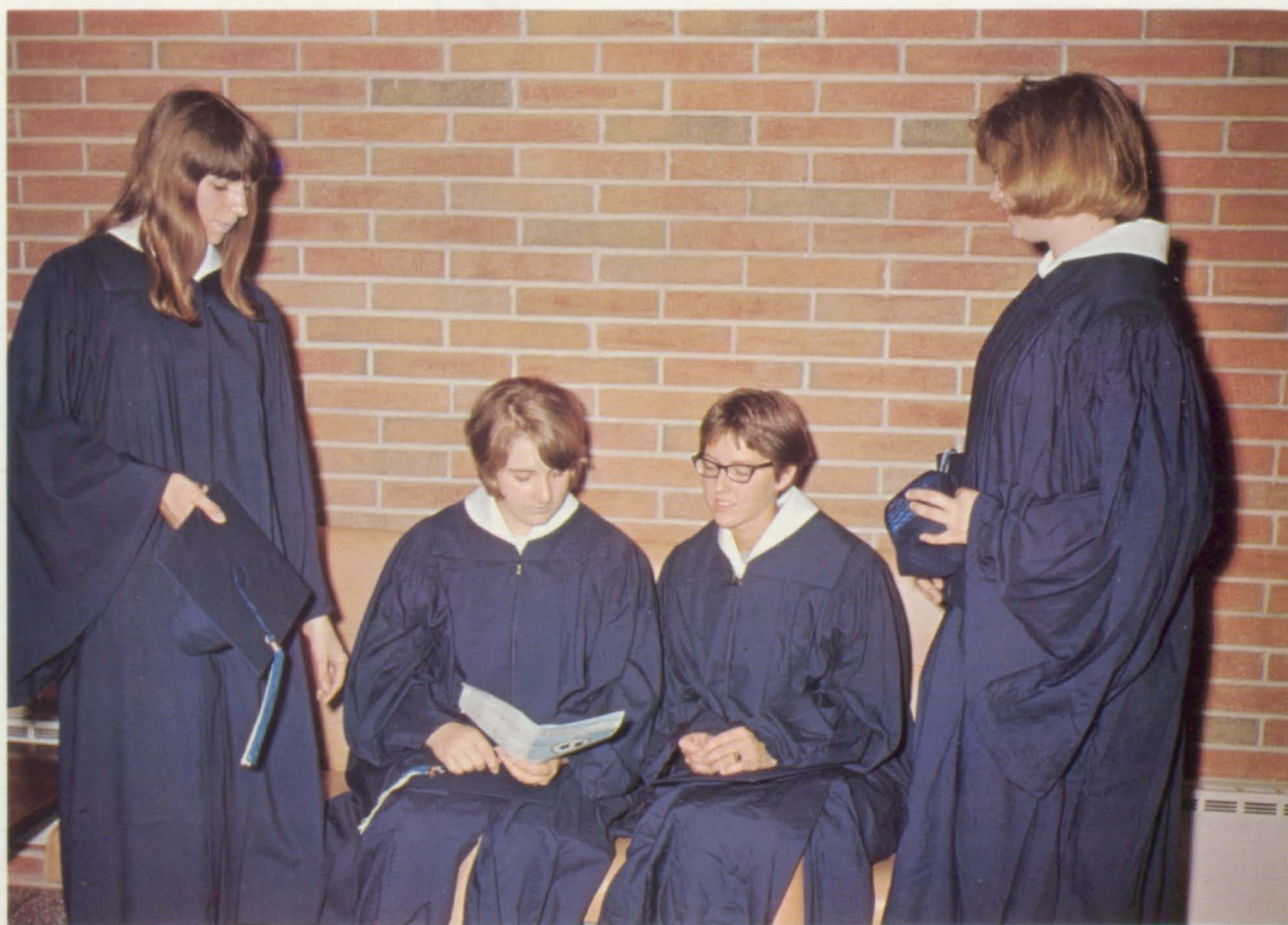
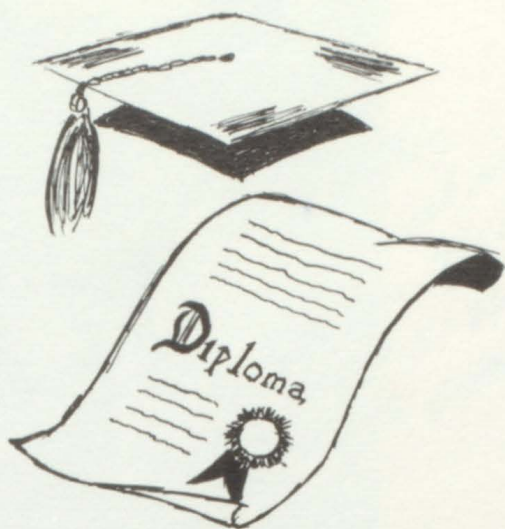
## COMMENCEMENT

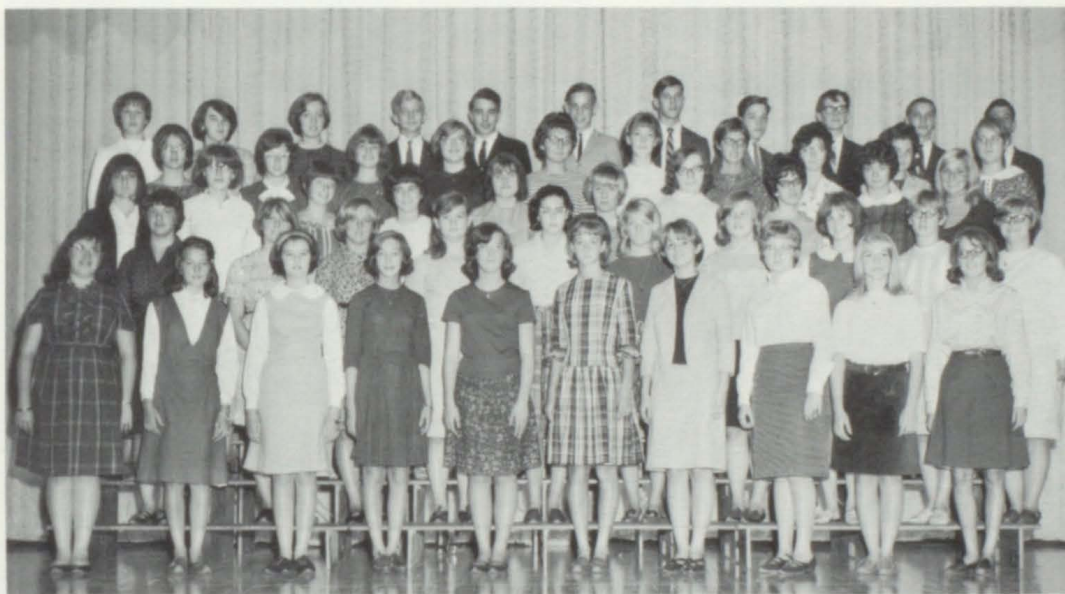


# OUR FUTURE

The year's activity consisted of the band's attendance at the annual Pretzel Bowl game, held on October 23, and in November, the Kutztown Homecoming.

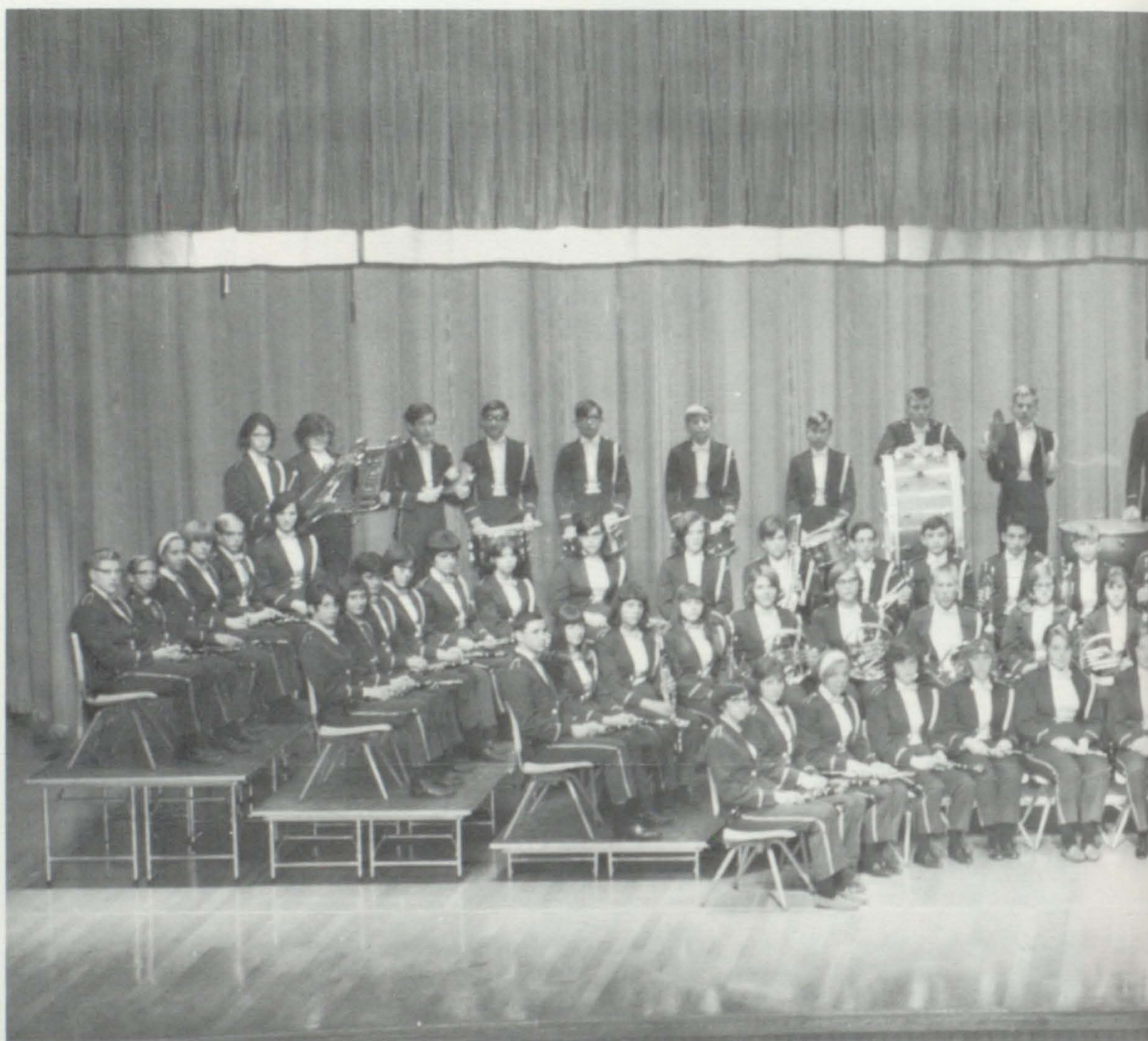

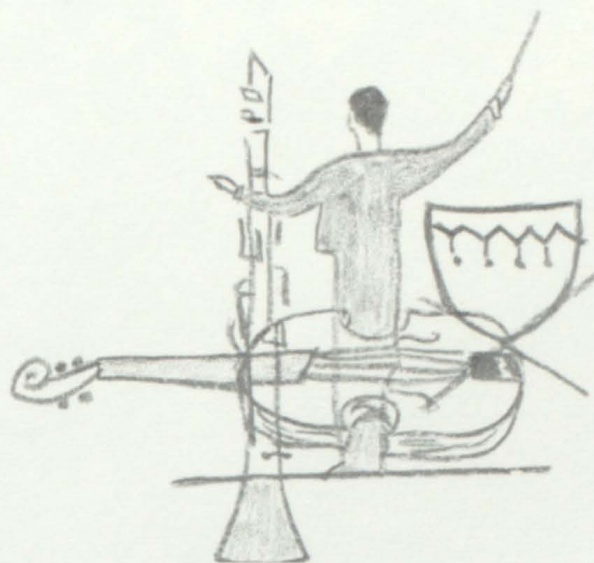

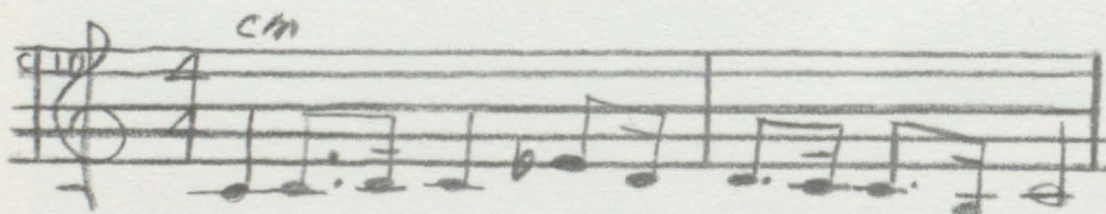

This segment of the music department is rarely functional. The main purpose of this fifteen piece band is to give its members experience and training in a more disciplined field of music.

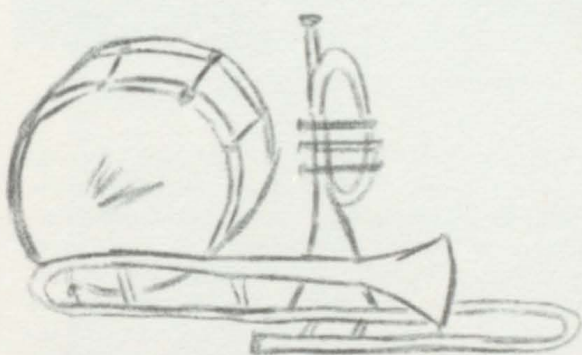
