Mrs. Ilene Batz graduated from Lehigh Community College. She serves as the general secretary as well as specifically working for Mr. Matthew.

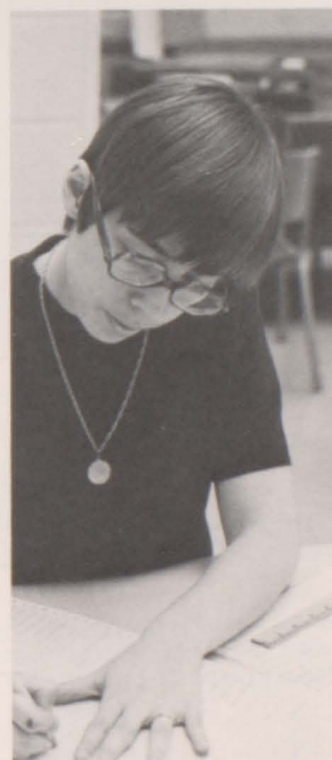

Mrs. Janet Himmelberger has gained practical experience before joining the Tulpehocken staff. She takes care of attendance records and purchasing orders.



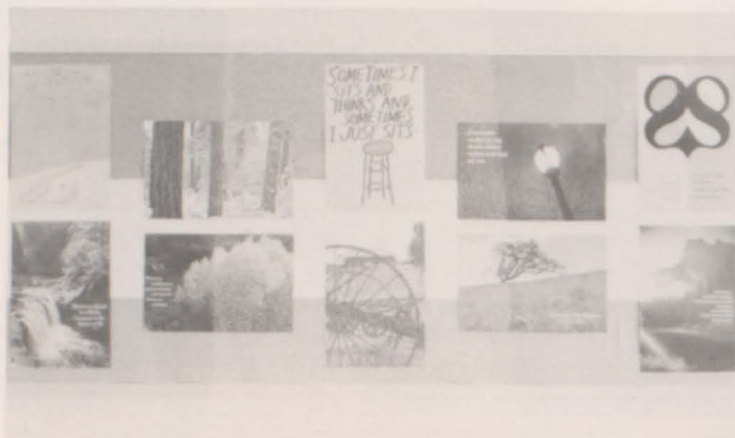

VARIOUS COURSES OFFERED

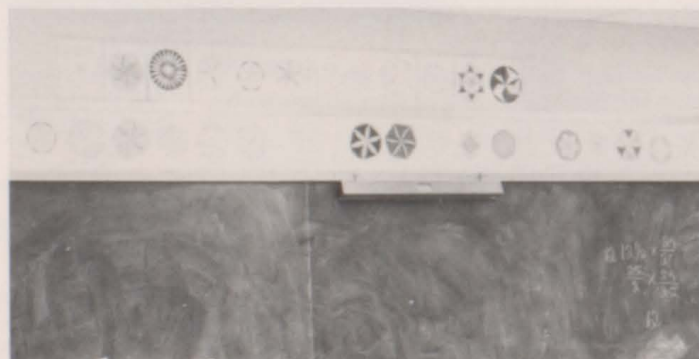


Mr. Larry Rentschler teaches Physics, Advanced Math, Algebra II, and Science. He is a Senior class advisor and Photography club advisor.

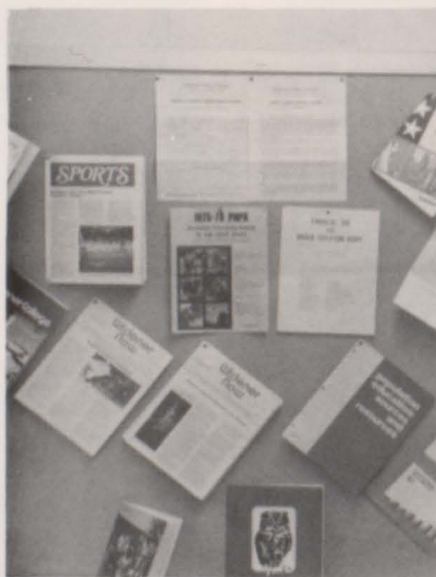


Mr. Michael Scarpignato teaches P.O.D. and Sociology. He is a Senior class advisor and Ping-Pong club advisor.

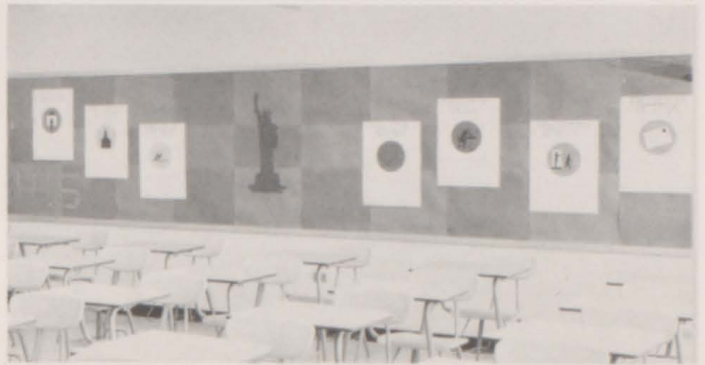

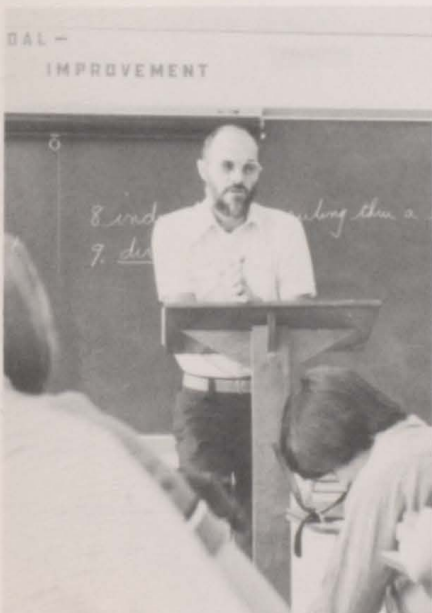

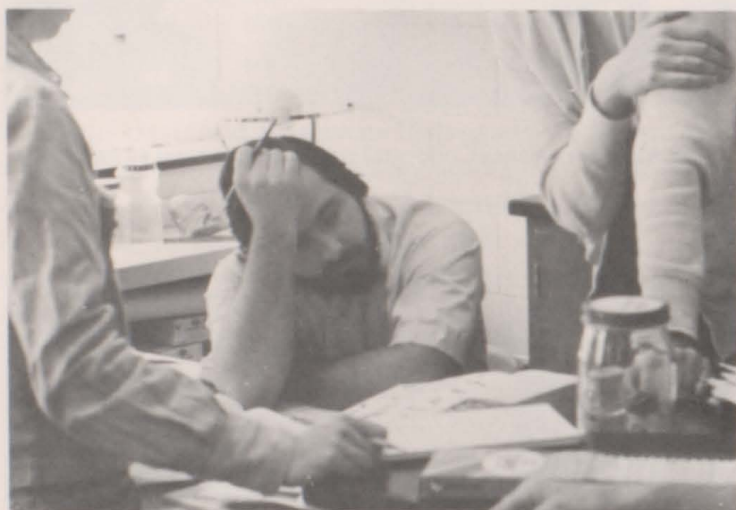
SCIENCE:

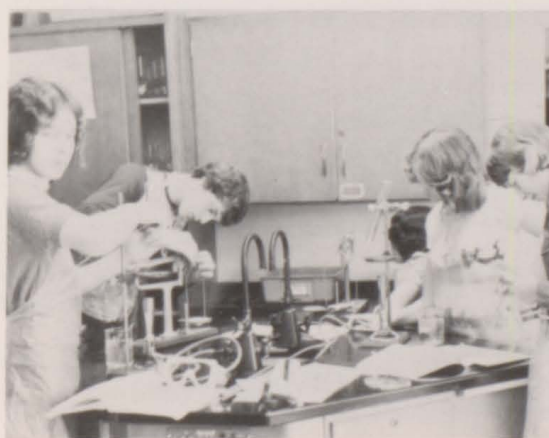

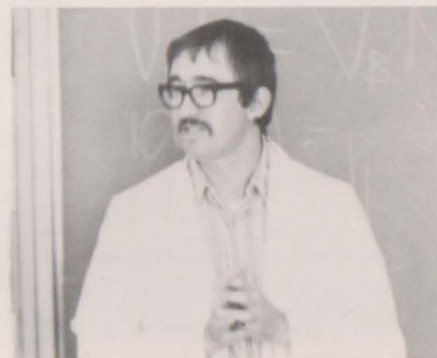

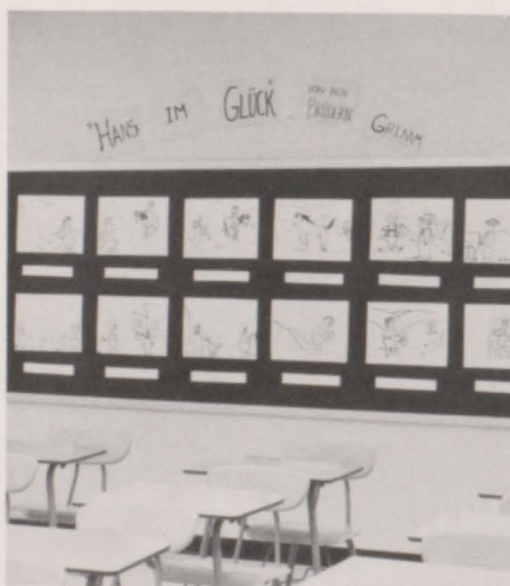

COMMERCIAL: BUSINESS PREPARATION FOR STUDENTS

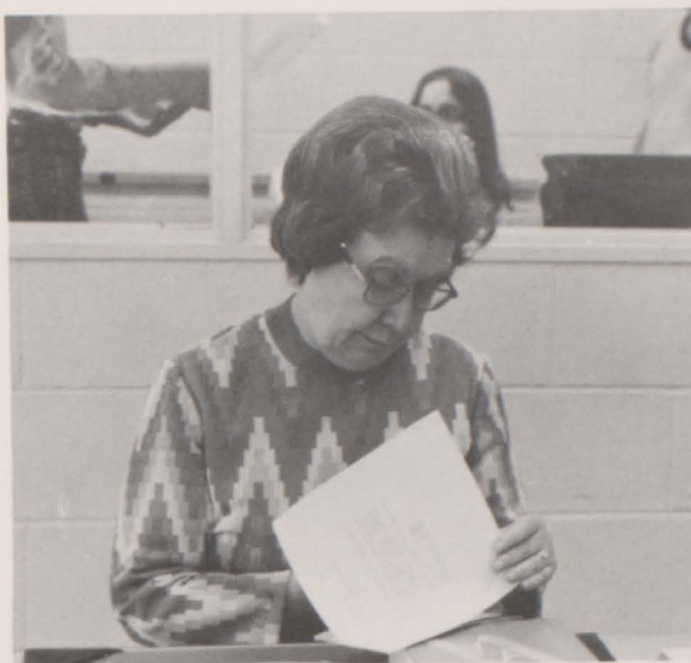

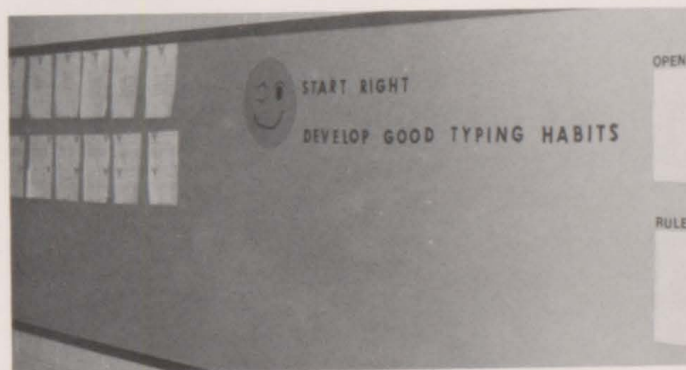

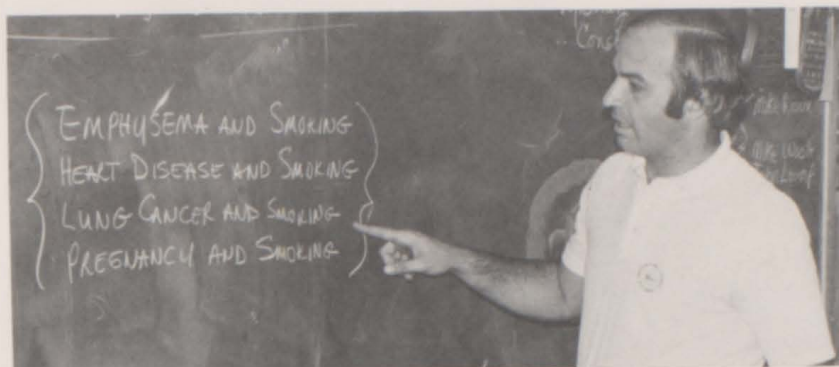

Mr. Carl Wolf teaches physical education and health classes. He is the high school athletic director and also the JV Soccer and Varsity Basketball coach.



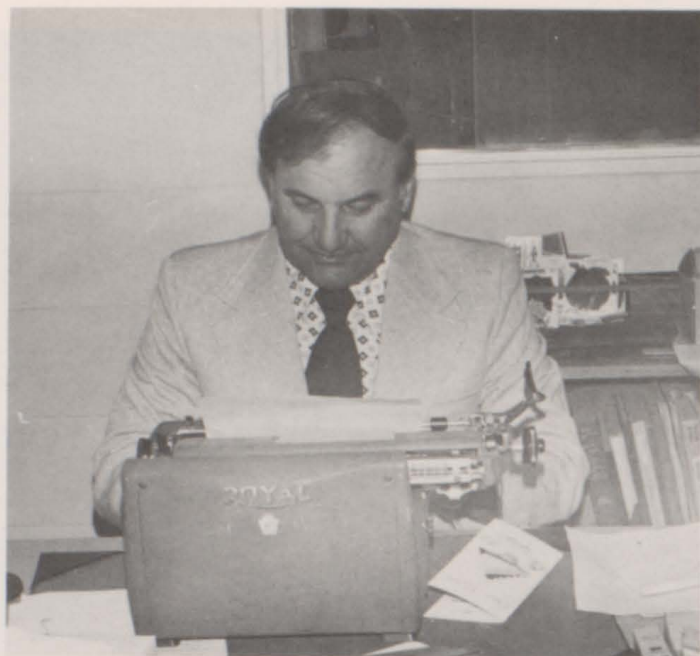

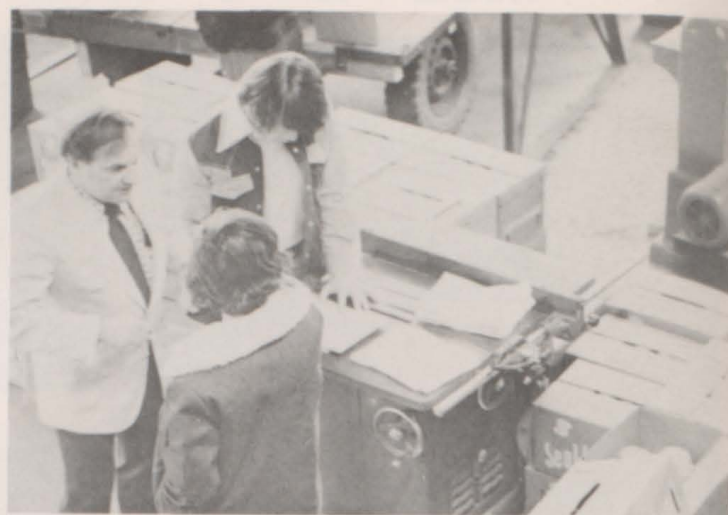


Mr. Michael Orendo teaches agriculture and horticulture. He advises the audio-visual club and FFA.

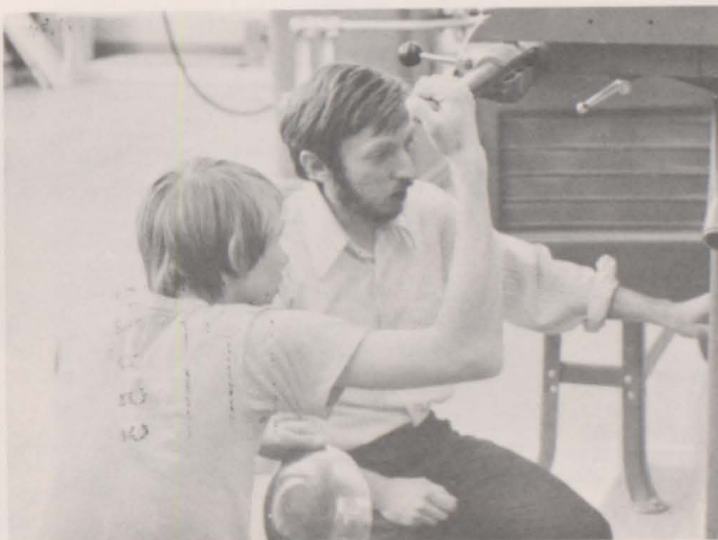

In District III competition we were eliminated in the first game by the Hempfield eleven 3-0. In this game there were many scoring opportunities for us which we couldn't capitalize on.

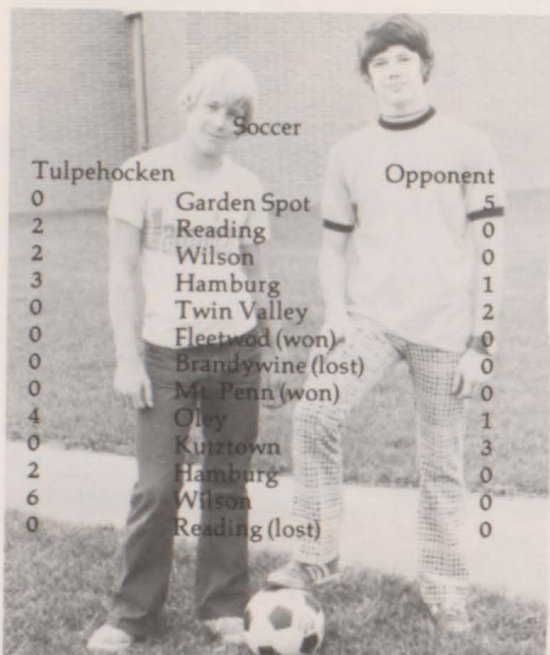
Next year's team will probably be mostly a senior team, having quite a number of juniors on the present team.

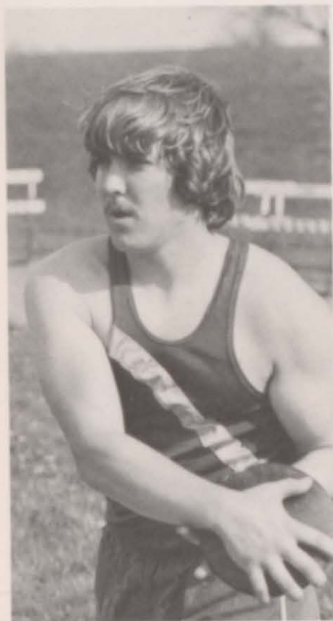
