



Then And Now

After Tulpehocken High School's first 25 years, its current generation of students are questioning the discipline code like never before. These teenagers will be shocked to learn the strict laws enforced in 1964 and 1965.

First, no one dressed in blue jeans! Girls always wore dresses; slacks were outlawed. The dress had to reach the floor when she kneeled. An ugly, black dress was given to the violator of this rule for the rest of the day.

Boys participating in sports had to have their hair cut at a certain length. Students could not go to lockers between classes. They did not wear jackets in the classroom. Shirts were always tucked into pants or dresses.

Paddling was as prevalent in 1965 as detention is now. Deviant teenagers were administered not one, not two, but three swats. This conformity forced upon students was also evident in the curriculum. For example, business students could not take an art elective. Students studying agriculture were never found in academic English classes. In short, students stayed in one track with the same students for four years.

Students nowadays must realize the incredible freedom they possess. After their freshman year, Tulpehocken students may register for virtually any course. They do not have to worry about a dress code each morning when they awake. They can be as individualistic as they want to be.


Officers And Junior Miss
