To the Honorable, the Judges of the within named Court:

The Petition of Edward R. Adams
of the 14th Ward of the City of Johnstown respectfully sheweth.
1st, that his name is Edward R. Adams
that he has resided therein for a period of Four Years

2d, That the place or house for which a license is desired is No. 153 Iron St.
in 14th Ward City of Johnstown

3d, That said applicant was born on the First day of October 1854
at M. Augustine in Cambria Co Pa and he was naturalized on the
day of _____, 18____, at _____ in _____

4th, That the owner of the premises is Budget M^c Dermott's Estate

5th, That the said place to be licensed is necessary for the accommodation of the public.

6th, That he is not in any manner pecuniarily interested in the profits of the business conducted at any other place in said county where any of said liquors are sold or kept for sale.

7th, That he is the only person in any manner pecuniarily interested in the business so asked to be licensed, and that no other person shall be in any manner pecuniarily interested therein, during the continuance of the license.

8th, That he has not had a license for sale of liquors in this Commonwealth, during any portion of the year preceding this application, revoked.

9th, That Patrick Rude and John Grogan, two
reputable freeholders of the 14th Ward City of Johnstown

where the liquor is to be sold, who will be his sureties on the bond which is required; and petitioner states that each of said sureties is a *bona-fide* owner of real estate in the said county, worth over and above all incumbrances, the sum of two thousand dollars, and that it would sell for that much at public sale, and that said sureties are not, nor are either of them engaged in the manufacture of spirituous, vinous, malt, or brewed, liquors.

10th, And he therefore prays your Honors to grant him a license at the place aforesaid, to sell spirituous, vinous, malt, or brewed liquors, in quantities not exceeding one quart. And he will pray, etc.
