8th, That *he* has not had a license for sale of liquors in this Commonwealth, during any portion of the year preceding this application, revoked.

where the liquor is to be sold, who will be.....*his*.....sureties on the bond which is required; and petitioner states that each of said sureties is a *bona-fide* owner of real estate in the said county, worth over and above all incumbrances, the sum of two thousand dollars, and that it would sell for that much at public sale, and that said sureties are not, nor are either of them engaged in the manufacture of spirituous, vinous, malt, or brewed, liquors.

10th, And *he* therefore prays your Honors to grant *him* a license at the place aforesaid, to sell spirituous, vinous, malt, or brewed liquors, in quantities not exceeding one quart. And he will pray, etc.
