each of them, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals and dated this *28th* day of *January*, A. D. 187*9*.

And, further, We do hereby empower the District Attorney of Cambria county to appear for us in the
Court of Common Pleas, of said county; and after filing one or more declarations, to confess judgment against
us for the above sum, with costs of suit and release of all errors.

THE CONDITION OF THE ABOVE OBLIGATION IS SUCH

That If the above bounden, *Henry Baerly*
shall pay all damages which may be recovered in any action which may be instituted against him un-
der the provisions of the Act of Assembly approved the 12th day of April, A. D. 1875, entitled, "An
Act to repeal an Act to permit the voters of this Commonwealth to vote every three years on the ques-
tion of granting licences to sell intoxicating liquors, and to restrain and regulate the sale of the same,"
and all costs, fines and penalties which may be imposed upon him in any indictment for violating said
Act, or any other law of this Commonwealth relating to selling or furnishing intoxicating drinks, and
shall well, truly and faithfully observe all the laws of the Commonwealth relating to his business of
Inn or Tavern keeper, for which he has received a license from the Court of Quarter Sessions, of
said County, then the obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
