are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the penal sum of Two Thousand Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, to be paid to the said Commonwealth, her certain attorney or assigns: to which payment well and truly to be made, we and each of us, do bind ourselves, and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seal. Dated the _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninty

NOW THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the above bounden W. W. Baker shall faithfully observe all the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania relating to the selling or furnishing of vinous, spirituous, malt or brewed liquors, or any admixtures thereof, and shall pay all damages which may be recovered in any action which may be instituted against him under the provisions of any Act of Assembly, and shall pay all costs, fines and penalties which may be imposed upon him under any indictment for violating the Act of May 13th, 1887, entitled "An Act to restrain and regulate the sale of vinous and spirituous, malt or brewed liquors or any admixtures thereof," or any other Act of Assembly relating to selling or furnishing liquors as aforesaid; then this Obligation shall be void and of no effect, or else shall be and remain in full force and virtue.

AND FURTHER, we do by these presents, empower The District Attorney for Cambria Co. Pa. or any other Attorney of any Court of Record of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to appear for us therein and confess judgment against us for the said penal sum, with cost of suit and release of all errors, and we do hereby waive the right of inquisition on real estate, and all laws exempting real or personal property from levy and sale on execution.
