He further represents that the said property is assessed at the sum of six hundred dollars, according to the last annual return of the assessor of the said Borough. He therefore prays the Court to grant him a license to keep an Inn or Tavern at the place herein named. And your petitioner will ever pray, &c.

We, the subscribers, citizens of Cambria Borough in which the above named petitioner asks to be licensed to keep an Inn or Tavern, do certify that we are personally acquainted with the petitioner and know him to be a citizen of the United States, and a man of good moral character and temperate in his habits; that he has at least four bed rooms, containing six beds for the exclusive use of strangers and travelers; and that such Inn or Tavern is necessary to accommodate the public and entertain strangers and travelers.

Know all Men by these Presents, THAT WE Edward L. Binder Henry Blum Julius Stieh Severin all of the Borough of Cambria, in the County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the just and full sum of two thousand dollars, lawful money of the United States, to be paid unto the said Commonwealth, her certain Attorneys or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

SEALED WITH OUR SEALS and dated this First day of February A. D., 1879.

The condition of this bond is such, That whereas the above bounden Edward L. Binder has received a license from the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria county to keep an Inn or Tavern in said Borough. Now if the said Edward L. Binder shall well, truly and faithfully observe all the laws of this Commonwealth relating to his business of Inn or Tavern keeper and shall pay all damages that shall be recovered in any action that may be instituted against him under the provisions of an act of Assembly entitled, "An Act to repeal an Act to permit the voters of this Commonwealth to vote every three years on the question of granting licenses to sell intoxicating liquors and to restrain and regulate the same," approved the 12th day of April, A. D., 1875; and also all costs, fines and penalties which may be imposed upon him in any indictment for violations of said Act or any other law of this Commonwealth relating to selling or furnishing intoxicating liquors, then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
