Boxler, Joseph Gerber of the County of Cambria and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, are jointly and severally held and bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the just and lawful sum of Two Thousand Dollars, lawful money, to which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators, and each of them, firmly, by these presents.

Sealed with our seals and dated this 11th day of March, A. D. 1883.




And, further, We do hereby empower the District Attorney of Cambria County to appear for us in the Court of Common Pleas of said County; and, after filing one or more declarations, to confess judgment against us for the above sum, with costs of suit and release of all errors.

## THE CONDITION OF THE ABOVE OBLIGATION IS SUCH

That, if the above bounden, Joseph Boxler shall pay all damages which may be recovered in any action which may be instituted against him under the provisions of the Act of Assembly approved the 12th day of April, A. D. 1875, entitled, "An Act to repeal an Act to permit the voters of this Commonwealth to vote every three years on the question of granting licenses to sell intoxicating liquors, and to restrain and regulate the sale of the same," and all costs, fines, and penalties which may be imposed upon him in any indictment for violating said Act, or any other law of this Commonwealth relating to selling or furnishing intoxicating drinks, and shall well, truly, and faithfully observe all the laws of the Commonwealth relating to his business of Inn or Tavern keeper, for which he has received a license from the Court of Quarter Sessions of said County, then the obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
