In the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of said County.

The petition of the undersigned, applicant for License to sell Vinous, Spirituous, Malt or Brewed Liquors, or any admixture thereof, at retail in quantities not exceeding one quart, sets out in conformity with the Act of Assembly, as follows, viz:

1. The name of your petitioner is Arnold Leuz

and his place of residence is the Portage Hotel, in the Borough of Gallitzin,

in Cambria County, where he has resided, continuously for fifteen years last past.

2. The House or Building for which License is prayed for and desired, is the 3-story frame hotel building, fifty by twenty-four (50 x 24) feet, containing fourteen rooms, well known as the Portage Hotel, situated at the corner of Main Street and the New Portage Railroad in the Borough of Gallitzin in said county, which said house has been a licensed Hotel for the past fifteen years.

3. The applicant for license is a citizen of the United States having been born in Allegheny Township, Cambria County, Pa., in the year 1857,

4. The owner of the premises prayed to be licensed is Arnold Leuz, the

5. That the place prayed to be licensed is necessary for the accommodation of the public.

6. That the applicant is not in any manner pecuniarily interested in the profits of the business conducted at any other place in Cambria County where any Vinous, Spirituous, Malt or Brewed Liquors, or any admixture thereof, are sold or kept for sale.

7. That the applicant is the only person in any manner pecuniarily interested in the business asked to be licensed, and that no other person shall be in any manner pecuniarily interested therein during the continuance of the license granted under this petition.

8. That the applicant ~~or either of them~~, has not had a license for the sale of liquor in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania during any portion of the year preceding this application revoked, and is at present the holder of a license from said Court.

9. That George Leuz, A. J. Sill, and Bert Leuz, three reputable freeholders of the County in said county where the Liquor is to be sold, will be his sureties on the bond required by the Act of Assembly. Petitioner further state that each of said sureties is a bona-fide owner of real estate in the said county, worth, over and above all incumbrances, the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, and that it would sell for that much at public sale, and that said sureties, or either of them, are not engaged in the manufacture of Spirituous, Vinous, Malt or Brewed Liquors.

Your petitioner—therefore pray that a license may be granted to him for one year, to sell at the place aforesaid, Spirituous, Vinous, Malt or Brewed Liquors, or any admixture thereof, in quantities not exceeding one quart.

And as in duty bound, your petitioner will ever pray.
