

Know all Men by these Presents, THAT WE *James Maulle*

sylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the just and full sum of two thousand dollars, lawful money of the United States, to be paid unto the said Commonwealth, her certain Attorneys or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

SEALED WITH OUR SEALS and dated this *thirtieth* day of *January* A. D., 1879.

THE CONDITION OF THIS BOND IS SUCH, That whereas the above bounden *James Maulle* has received a license from the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria county to keep an Inn or Tavern in said *Borough*. Now if the said *James*

Maulle shall well, truly and faithfully observe all the laws of this Commonwealth relating to his business of Inn or Tavern keeper and shall pay all damages that shall be recovered in any action that may be instituted against him under the provisions of an act of Assembly entitled, "An Act to repeal an Act to permit the voters of this Commonwealth to vote every three years on the question of granting licenses to sell intoxicating liquors and to restrain and regulate the same," approved the 12th day of April, A. D., 1875; and also all costs, fines and penalties which may be imposed upon him in any indictment for violations of said Act or any other law of this Commonwealth relating to selling or furnishing intoxicating liquors, then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
