LICENSE BOND.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, A. Padula, *C. F. O'Donnell*
and Joseph Egar sureties all of Cambria County, Penna, are held and
firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Penna. in the penal sum of Two
Thousand Dollars, to be paid to the said Commonwealth, ~~to~~ certain
attorney or assigns to which the payment will and truly be made, we and
each of us do bind ourselves, our and each ^{of our} executors and administrators
firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this 15 day
of January, 1897.

Now the condition of this obligation is such, that if the
above bounden, A. Padula, to whom a license has been granted to sell
by wholesale in quantities not less than one quart of spirituous or
vinous liquors and not less than twelve pint bottles of malt or brewed
liquors, shall faithfully observe all the laws of this Commonwealth
relative to selling or furnishing of spirituous, vinous, malt or brewed
liquors at wholesale and shall pay any damages which may be recovered in
any action which may be instituted against him under the provisions of
the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Penna., approved June 9th,
1891, or any other Act of Assembly relating to selling or furnishing
liquors as aforesaid, and shall pay all costs, fines and penalties which
may be imposed upon him the said A. Padula under any indictment for
violating any of the provisions approved June 9th, 1891, or any other
Act of Assembly relative to the selling or furnishing spirituous, vinous
malt or brewed liquors aforesaid, then this obligation to be void, other-
wise to remain in full force and virtue.

do by these presents empower R. S. Murphey, Dist. Attorney for Cambria
County, or any other Attorney of any Court of record of the Commonwealth
