THIS PETITION respectfully represents that your petitioner a citizen of the United States, of good moral character and temperate habits, and desire to keep a Hotel, Inn or Tavern, and pray your Honorable Court to grant him a license, under the laws of this Commonwealth, to sell liquors in quantities not exceeding one quart.

Your petitioner further represents:

1st. That his name is Vincent J. Stolzy  
present residence is Borough of Carrolltown, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania  
and he has resided there for Six years last past,

2d. The particular place for which license is desired is known as the Gray Hotel, situate in the Borough of Carrolltown, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, a two story Hotel 60 X 74 feet well finished, fronting on Main Street on the East, land of heirs of Sarah Schrott, on the South St. Joseph Street on the West and land of Joseph A. Gray on the North. Your petitioner and his family reside in said Hotel, and pray to be licensed.

Said house has been licensed for the past Six years.

3d. That your petitioner Vincent J. Stolzy  
was born at Carroll Township, County of Cambria in the  
State of Pennsylvania

and naturalized in the Court of  
at March in the A. D. 1866 on the 30th day  
of March Eighteen hundred and sixty-six

4th. The name of the owner of the premises where said business is to be conducted is Vincent J. Stolzy  
your petitioner

5th. That the place to be licensed is necessary for the accommodation of the public.

6th. That your petitioner is not in any manner interested in the profits of the business conducted at any other place in said County, where any of said liquors are sold or kept for sale.

7th. That your petitioner is the only person in any manner pecuniarily interested in the business so asked to be licensed, and that no other person shall be in any manner pecuniarily interested therein during the continuance of said license.

8th. Your petitioner has not had a license for the sale of Liquor in this Commonwealth revoked during any portion of the year preceding this application. or at any other time heretofore.

9th. That Joseph A. Gray and Philip Barker  
are two reputable freeholders of the said County of Cambria, Pennsylvania  
where the liquor is to be sold, who will be his sureties in the bond of your petitioner required by law. That each of said proposed sureties is a bona fide owner of real estate in said County, worth, over and above all incumbrances, the sum of TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS, and that it would sell for that sum at public sale;—and that neither of said sureties is engaged in the manufacture of spirituous, vinous, malt or brewed liquors.

Your petitioner further represents that the said house where said business is to be conducted is well provided with rooms and accommodations for strangers and travellers, and contains fourteen bed-rooms, provided with nineteen beds, for the exclusive use of strangers and travellers.
