A A civil jury finds former foothall star O.J. Simpson liable for the June 12,1994 wrongful deaths of his ex-wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, and her friend, Ronaid Goldman. In a unanimous verdict, the jury awards $\$ 8.5$ million in compensatory damages to Goldman's parents. The Erown and Goldman families are each awarded $\$ 12.5$ million in punitive damages.
