

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Cambria
at a Court holden in and for said County, the 21st day of
Sept. A. D. 1906;

The petition of Frederick Kuntzberger, a native of
now residing in Portage Township, in the
County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully sheweth:

That your petitioner arrived in the United States of America, to-wit: At the port of Philadelphia
in the State of Penna., on or
about the 31st day of October A. D. 1881, being
then under the age of eighteen years, to-wit, of the age of Twenty years, and
is now above the age of twenty-one years; that he has resided within the limits and jurisdiction of the
United States for five years last past, and for one year last past within the State of Pennsylvania, and that
during more than two years last past, it has been his intention to become a citizen of the United States; that
he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility in Germany

from whence he came; that he does not disbelieve in nor is he opposed to
all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining
and teaching such disbelief or opposition; that he does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or prop-
riety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any specific individual or of officers generally, of the Gov-
ernment of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official charac-
ter; and that he has not violated any of the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to regulate
the Immigration of Aliens into the United States," approved March 3, 1903. He therefore prays your
Honor to admit him to become a citizen of the United States of America, agreeably to the Act of Congress
in such case made and provided.

I, Frederick Kuntzberger, the petitioner above named, do
in my solemn oath declare that the contents of my petition are true; that for upwards of two years next
preceding it has been my bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States; that I will support
the Constitution of the United States, and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all alle-
giance and fidelity to every foreign prince, potentate, state and sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly
to the Emperor of Germany of whom I was a subject.

Oath of Witness

of America five years at least, and within the State of Pennsylvania one year at least; that he now resides
in Portage Township Cambria Co. Pennsylvania;

that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the
Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and
that to the best of deponent's knowledge and belief, it has been for two years next preceding this appli-
cation the bona fide intention of the petitioner to become a citizen of the United States; that the appli-
cant or petitioner does not disbelieve in, nor is he opposed to, all organized government; that he is not a
member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief or opposition;
that he does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of
any specific individual or of officers generally of the Government of the United States or of any other
organized government, because of his or their official character; and that he has not violated any of the
provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to regulate the Immigration of Aliens into the United
States," approved March 3, 1903.
