

Dickinson Seminary Singers To Assist In Production Of Bucknell University Oratorio

Lewisburg, June 2. — Bucknell university will observe Alumni and Fraternity day tomorrow, with graduates from twelve classes scheduled to return to the campus for the reunions and dinners that are an annual feature of the commencement program.

Dr. Edward W. Pangburn, Philadelphia, president of the Alumni association, will preside at the annual business meeting of the alumni council tomorrow morning.

The university's women graduates will have their inning when the Alumnae association meets at noon for its annual business meeting and luncheon.

Gilbert Somers Perez, superintendent of vocational education in the Philippine Islands, who travelled more than 8,000 miles to be on hand for commencement at his alma mater, will figure prominently in the alumni celebrations. Mr. Perez is a graduate with the class of 1907.

Classes holding reunion will be those of '73, '78, '83, '88, '93, '98,

'03, '08, '13, '18, '23 and '28. Dr. Homer P. Rainey, Bucknell president, has invited as his special guests the seven surviving members of the class of 1883, which will be observing its fiftieth anniversary.

The alumni will attend the fraternity symposia tomorrow evening, after which they will be entertained at the annual commencement play, "The Queen's Husband", presented by the college dramatic society, Cap and Dagger.

Dr. Homer P. Rainey will give the Baccalaureate address in the Baptist church Sunday morning and in the afternoon the Symphony orchestra will present its annual concert. Bucknell's music students, assisted by the Dickinson Seminary Choral club, and four guest soloists will present Mendelssohn's oratorio, "St. Paul", Sunday evening.

Dr. Kenneth B. Murdock, dean of the faculty of arts and science at Harvard university, will be the speaker at the commencement exercises Monday afternoon.

Commencement Week At Dickinson Begins Today

Commencement week at Dickinson Seminary and Junior college will begin today when the art exhibit will be opened in Bradley hall, at 3 o'clock.

At 8 o'clock this evening the senior-junior recital will take place in the seminary chapel.

The baccalaureate service will take place in the Pine Street Methodist church on Sunday, at 10:30 a. m., with the Rev. John William Flynn, D. D., pastor of the Tabernacle Methodist church in Binghamton, preaching the sermon.

At 6 p. m., the annual song service will be held on the campus and Dr. Flynn will speak.

At 10 o'clock Monday morning the junior class day exercises will be held in the chapel and will be

followed by the planting of the ivy. The senior class play, "Who Wouldn't Be Crazy", will be given at 8 p. m.

The senior class day exercises will take place at 10 a. m., Tuesday, followed by the fraternity and sorority luncheons and class reunions. During the afternoon there will be a program of athletics on the campus.

The alumni business meeting will take place at 4 p. m., in the chapel and the alumni banquet will take place at 6:30 p. m.

Commencement exercises will take place at 9:30 a. m., Wednesday and will close the week's program. Presentation of awards and scholarships will be announced at this time.
