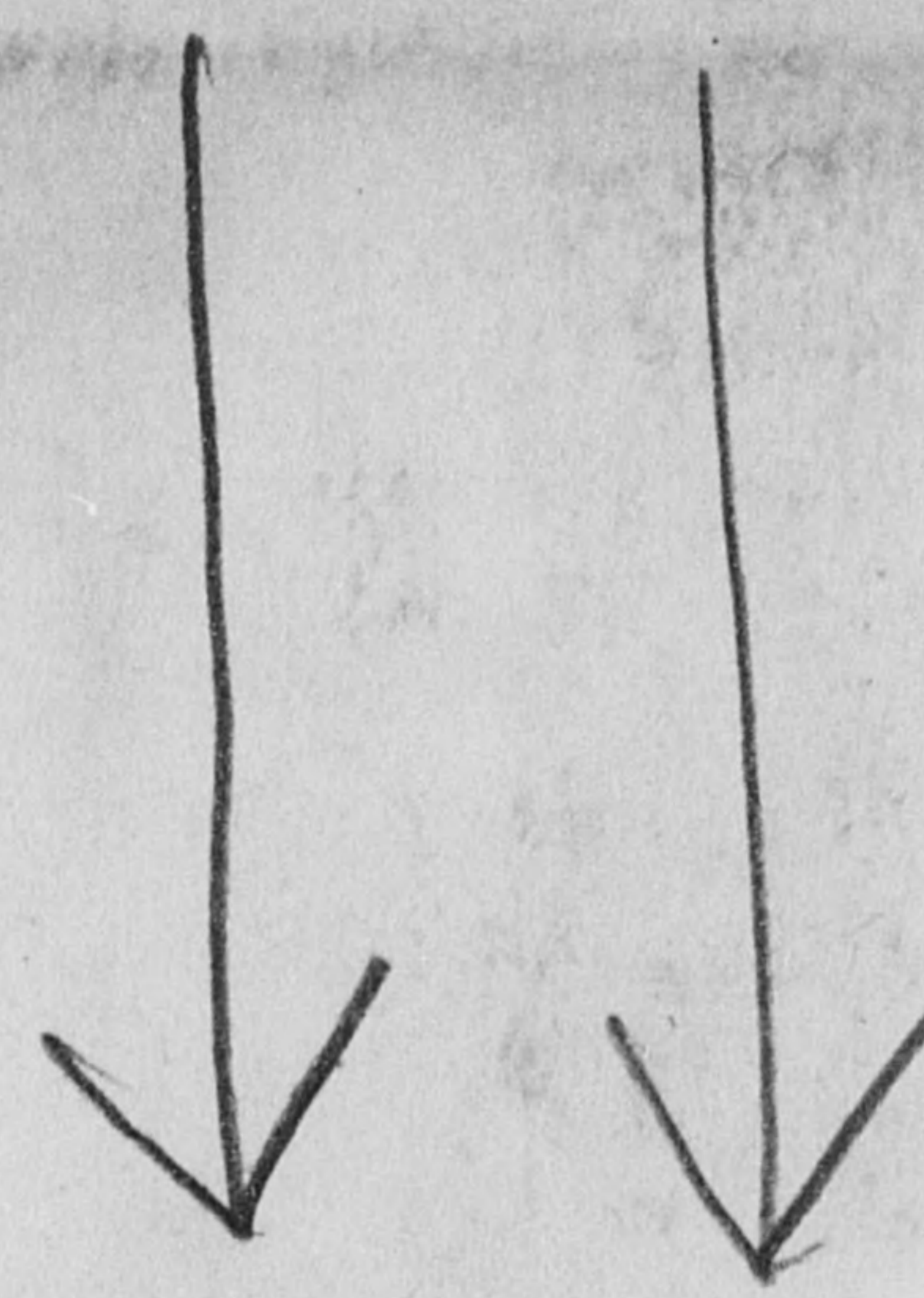

Cherry and White and Dickinson Union Receives Recognition In Columbia University Contest Recently.

Word has been received here that the Cherry and White, Williamsport High School monthly magazine, and the Dickinson Union, Williamsport Dickinson Junior College magazine, were awarded ties for first place at the Columbia Scholastic Press Association contest now being held in New York City.

The high school publication was listed as tied with the Central High School Impressions, Scranton, for the senior high school magazine award.

The Dickinson Union was listed on a par with the Ogontz School Mosaic, Rydal, in the junior college magazine group.

The local publications were among the 1,114 entered in the annual contest held at Columbia University.
