McKay Shakes Up Dickinson's Line For Wyoming Tilt

Three line changes, designed to bolster the Dickinson Junior College defense for the home-coming tussle with Wyoming Seminary, a traditional foe, here Saturday, were disclosed yesterday by Coach Earl Z. McKay as the Hilltoppers whaled away in a bristling intra-squad scrimmage.

Tackle Harry Nixon, End Frank Camp and Co-captain Arnold Bricker, a guard, were demoted in a shake-up which McKay hopes will lead to correct shortcomings evident in the Gold and White brigade's 7-7 statemate with Keystone Junior College last Saturday.

Bill Hanley, a converted tackle, is being groomed for Camp's wing job; Johnny Eberhart, Williamsport High product, has moved in on Nixon, also an ex-Millionaire; and Fred Sansalone has supplanted Bricker.

With the recovery of Norm Cadle

from a leg injury, Dickinson's offense will also be strengthened for the Wyoming tiff. Cadle is expected to be ready, but a question mark hovers over the name of Johnny Morrocco, another first string back who is on the injured list with an ailing leg.

Bowers Stays in Backfield

Although Cadle's return will help overcome the shortage of backs, McKay plans to keep Bill Bowers, converted end, and Charlie Brachbill, a guard by trade, in the backfield. Bowers impressed at the blocking assignment against Keystone last Saturday and looms as a fine prospect at his new post.

McKay lectured his charges about talking in the huddle, claiming that the free speech hindered Quarterback Ray Schneider Saturday.

Another scrimmage is slated for today and the Gold and White mentor intends to switch on the pressure.
