Your petitioner, therefore, prays that he may be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of American do swear, that the facts set forth in this my petition; I, are true, and that I will support the Constitution of the United States; and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce, and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, and sovereignty whatever; and, particularly, do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to whereof I was heretofore a subject. Sworn and subscribed in open Court, this the United States and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do swear, that the petitioner, has resided within the limits, and under the jurisdiction of the United States of America five years, and within the State of Perinsylvania the year; that is to say, he the said years & upwards which place is within and under the Constitution of the Utiled States; and that during his residence within the United States, he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same: Sworn and subscribed in open court, this
