*of Italy* of whom I am a subject.

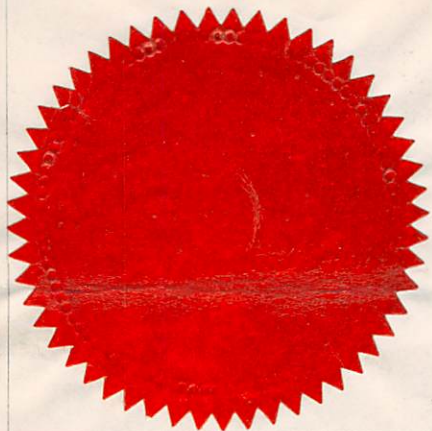

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Cambria,  
at a Court holden in and for said County, the fifth day of  
January A. D. 1891<sup>1903</sup>

The petition of Filippo Basso, a native of  
Italy, now residing in Dysart, the County of  
Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully showeth: that  
your petitioner arrived in the United States of America, to-wit: At the port of  
New York, in the State of New York, on or about the  
eighth day of March A. D. 1882, and that in pur-  
suance of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to establish an uniform rule of nat-  
uralization," made a declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United  
States, conformably to said Act, before the Prothonotary  
of Clearfield County, in the State of  
Pennsylvania, on the first day of October  
A. D. 1891<sup>1888</sup>

that he has resided within  
the limits and jurisdiction of the United States for five years last past, and for one  
year last past within the State of Pennsylvania; that he has never borne any hered-  
itary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility in Italy  
from whence he came. He therefore prays that  
he may become a citizen of the United States, and he will ever pray, &c.
