The petition of Vincent Bejeir

Respectfully represents: That he is a native of Austria, and is a citizen or subject of the Francis Joseph

that he has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States of America five years at least immediately preceding this application, and within the State of Pennsylvania one year at least; and that two years at least prior to this application he declared his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States, in the manner required by law, as in and by the certificate hereto attached appears; that he does not disbelieve in nor is he opposed to all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief or opposition; that he does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any specific individual or of officers generally, of the Government of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character; and that he has not violated any of the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to regulate the Immigration of Aliens into the United States," approved March 3, 1903. He therefore prays your Honor to admit him to become a citizen of the United States of America agreeably to the Act of Congress in such case made and provided.

I, Vincent Bejeir, the petitioner above named, do

swear that the facts set forth in this petition are true; that I will support the Constitution of the United States, and that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty, and particularly to the

Francis Joseph Emperor of Austria

of which I was before a subject.

and particularly to Francis Joseph Emperor,
of whom he was heretofore a subject.
