The petition of Christian Beffinger of Nepe-Saunstadt

HUMBLY SHEWETH:

That your petitioner is a native of Nepe-Saunstadt, Germany
and was heretofore a subject of Ludwig II Duke of Nepe-Saunstadt and

that he has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States of America, for five years,
and within the state of Pennsylvania one year; and that the said Christian Beffinger
declared his intention to become a citizen of the
United States at the Lehman Inn of the court of common
pleas in the County of Ohio, Virginia as by the
certificate hereunto attached more fully at large

appears:—that he will support the constitution of the United States; and that he doth absolutely and entirely
renounce, and forever abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, and sovereignty

whatever, and particularly, to Ludwig II Duke of Nepe-Saunstadt

whereof he was heretofore a subject. Your petitioner, therefore, prays that he may be admitted to become a
citizen of the United States of America.

I, Christian Beffinger do swear, that the facts set forth in this my petition,
are true, and that I will support the Constitution of the United States; and that I do absolutely and entirely re-
nounce, and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, and sovereignty what-
ever; and, particularly, do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to
Ludwig II Duke of Nepe-Saunstadt
whereof I was heretofore a subject.

following report of myself to the County Court for the
County of Ohio in the State of Virginia that is to say
I report that I was born in the Duchy of Hesse Darmstadt
in Germany on or about the 1st day of January in the
Year 1815 being now in the 35th year of my age that
I am a subject of Ludwig D Duke of Hesse Darmstadt
owing allegiance to that Monarch and none other that I
migrated from the City of London England on the 15th
day of April 1846 and arrived at New York City in the
State of New York in the United States on the 13th
June 1846 and that I arrived at Wheeling in the State of
Virginia one of the United States on or about the 5th
day of January 1849 where I intend to settle myself

oath that it is bona fide his intention to become a citizen
of the United States and to renounce forever all allegiance
and fidelity to every foreign Prince Potentate
State or Sovereign whatever and particularly to
the Duke of Hesse Darmstadt whose subject he now
