Commemorative Bill of Rights Displayed in Resource Center

The 200th Anniversary of the Bill of Rights is the Subject of A Commemoritive display entitled "To Preserve These Rights." The display is being shown at 15 area colleges and universities and 199 secondary schools throughout Pennsylvania. IBM is supporting the display.

The exhibit is made up of 12 panels, each of which details a particular set of rights and illustrates it with the text of the relevant amendments, photographs, and quotations by key statesmen and jurists who have interpeted the Bill of Rights.

Accompanying the exhibit is a specially prepared users guide which explains each theme in greater detail. This 84-page guide includes historical essays, lesson plans for secondary teachers, a bibliography, a filmography, and help for librarians.

"To Preserve These Rights" is based on a successful display defining the Constitution called

"The Blessings of Liberty." It was distributed in 1987 by the Pennsylvania Humanities Council (PHC). Dr. Joan Challinor, research associate at the National Museum of American History, headed the project.

Corporate and Foundation support has made it possible for schools, state- and nation-wide, to receive the exhibit. Libraries, historical societies, courthouses, and other public set sites are showing the exhibit. The set can also be purchased directly from the Pennsylvania Humanities Council for \$150.

The PHC was founded in 1972, is a private non-profit organization. It serves as the state's affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities. PHC provides grants, resources and special programs in the humanities for Pennsylvania's adult, out-of-school public.

This exhibit has been officially recognized by the National Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.
