The Drama Club chose this play because it touches on some very important topics that are valid today: individuality, human rights, the influence of heredity and environment, fighting those influences, fighting propriety, and so on. It was originally produced in 1879, and it was considered a breakthrough drama for its time; it was not common in the Victorian era to have a woman fight against the tides, and go against her husband.

At the end of the play, Nora makes her final choice, and tries a new door. That is the door slam heard around the world, as Nora chooses to walk a different path, alone.

The show ran Thursday, Nov. 10 to Sunday, Nov. 13 in The Science Center Black Box Theater.
