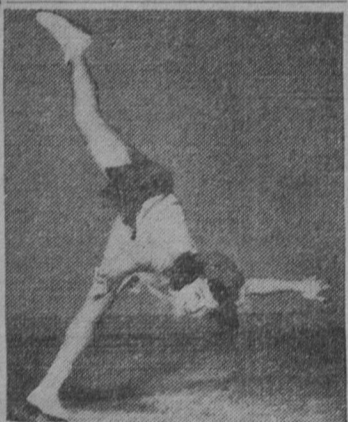

Hershey High — Milton Hershey School

High school football stock remained high here after the past weekend when the Derry Township High Trojans set down Gettysburg 15-0 to climb into the South Penn conference lead.

The Milton Hershey High Spartans racked up their third victory in a row by defeating tough Steelton, 19-14. Both teams played away.

The Trojans, stepping out into the loop lead in their bid to repeat as South Penn champions, swamped Gettysburg in the statistics department as the Chocolatetowners rolled up 19 first downs to the Warriors' five.

The classy Hershey offensive power and rugged line play dominated the contest throughout.

It was Hershey's seventh win in an undefeated season to date. The Trojan record is marred only by a tie with Chambersburg, and the pupils of Coach Ed Fornwalt have won three straight since that deadlock.

The Milton Hershey eleven smashed to victory over Steelton with less than three minutes to play as the aggressive hill school lads came from behind a one-point deficit to win.

Johnny Elway's pass-pitching to Austin Kraft and John Navilliat hauled the Spartans into position to score the winning touchdown as gametime was fading.

The Milton Hershey record stands at five wins and two losses at this point in the season.

The Spartans have scored 149 points against their opponents' 83, and have two games remaining on the schedule before the Nov. 21 Milton Hershey-Derry Township High contest. The Spartans meet Patterson Park High of Baltimore here on Saturday.

Hershey High's Trojans have racked up 186 points this season while permitting only two touchdowns—totalling 13 points—by their opponents.

They clash with Hanover here Friday night, then are idle until the inter-Hershey tilt with the Spartans.
