HERSHEY Y. M. C. A. WINS SENSATIONAL GAME

ONLY DEFEATS FIFTH WARD BY HARD WORK IN SATURDAY'S TEN INNING CONTEST

In one of the most brilliant games of base ball played on the home grounds this season, the Hershey Y. M. C. A. defeated the Fifth Ward team champions of Lebanon by the score of 4-3. The Lebanon team is composed of nine clean cut players who know how to play the game and gave the home team one of the hardest games this season. The fielding of both teams was faultless, many balls that appeared to be sure hits were pulled down only after a brilliant running catch or stop. For the visitors, Witman, Hallman and Reddinger, starred the former making two of the most sensational catches seen on the local diamond this season.

For the home team, Early, Shaub, and Matthews done wonders. Matthews pitched wonderful ball having 17 strikeouts and allowed only seven hits which were widely scattered. Captain Early was a demon on the paths, stealing three bases and scoring two runs. Shaub was the man with the big stick having four hits out of four times at bat, including two triples, a double and a single. It was not until the tenth inning that Hershey won the game. Early the first man up in the tenth beat out an infield hit, advanced to second on Shoaps infield grounder, and on Shaubs fourth hit of the game was held on third, but scored a minute later on Saylor's long fly to center field.
