Our allies, the British are well intentioned, but they are slow to learn that we Americans do not want outside influence in running our affairs. There is Churchill advocating the election of Roosevelt, and General Smuts telling us that our soldiers should be the ones to open the new offensive in Europe. . . . . .

A great many agencies are being organized in our coun-try to get certain things done. One that we feel should be successful is that one advocating a ceiling be placed on tax-They want national and state laws enacted limiting the punt of taxes levied against each individual. The State does this in Pennsylvania, by limiting the amount of real estate taxes that can be levied in townships, boroughs and cities. It has worked well, and could be extended to cover the nation.

#### . . . . . Thanksgiving

President Roosevelt changed the date of Thanksgiving Day several years ago, and caused confusion and grumbling. To prevent such a change in the future when some future president might fix it in July, the Congress on December 19, 1941, enacted a law fixing the fourth Thursday in Novem-ber as Thanksgiving Day. Although Congress has the authority to repeal this act, it however will probably eliminate forever the confusion that has previously existed. Thanks-giving Day has now been stabilized for all future years on the fourth Thursday of November.

The Bankhead Bill, now before Congress, appropriates \$15,000,000 to pay for advertising in newspapers in towns with a population under 10,000. A Senator broadcast-ing, this week, said this should not be enacted. If passed, it ould mean that the administration is buying the small newspapers.

When the Government buys guns, trucks, or anything else, it pays cash for them. The only commodity that it asks for nothing is advertising. The Senator opposes paying for this advertising, something that costs money to produce, but accepts money for his services. And it is a question whether the services of the newspaper, given for nothing, is not of more value to the country than that given by the Senator.

By the way, The Recorder will not be eligible for any of this advertising, and is not talking for itself.

#### Christmas Shopping

Appeals are being made to our people to do their Christ-mas shopping early. The office of the Postmaster General in Washington bluntly states that it will be impossible for the Post Office and other delivery facilities to assure deliv-ery of gifts by Christmas unless most Christmas shopping and mailing is completed during November.

Therefore, if you want to do your part in helping the borough and the nation's badly overtaxed postal, transporta-tion and manpower situation, do your Christmas shopping and mailing early. This means to many of us that Christmas will come a month earlier than usual.




