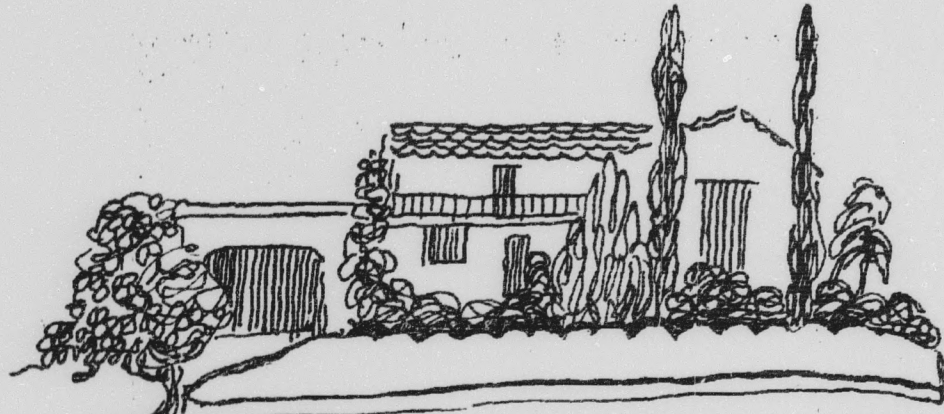

JACOB LAWRENCE

Jacob Lawrence, according to genealogies of the Lawrence family of New York, is a direct descendant of Sir Robert Lawrence of Ashton Hall, who was the son of Robert Lawrence of Lankershire, born about 1150. Sir Robert Lawrence was knighted for services during the crusades. Is a descendant of Major Thomas Lawrence born about March 8, 1619, one of the patentees of Newtown, Long Island.

Jacob Lawrence b. 1732, d. March 18, 1813, at the age of eighty-one years and three months. Married Sarah, who d. September fourth, 1805, in seventy-sixth year. Both buried in Baptist Churchyard, Netherwood, Pleasant Valley, New York, and their tombstones are in excellent condition. They moved from Westchester County, New York, to Dutchess County, New York, during the Revolution. According to the United States Census of 1790, Jacob Lawrence owned two slaves. Issue: 1. RICHARD LAWRENCE

Richard Lawrence (Jacob's), b. March 14, 1756, d. January 26, 1837. Buried in Baptist Churchyard Netherwood, Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York.

Richard served in the Revolution from Dutchess County.* He later went to Virginia and taught school. There he married Betty Glass. By this marriage he had one son, Robert Lawrence, born October 9, 1785. Betty Glass Lawrence died, and Richard returned to Dutchess County. There he married Deborah Shadbolt Lawrence, widow of his brother, John Lawrence. She was born February 29, 1768 and died January 16, 1848. She was the daughter of Thomas Shadbolt.

Richard was a deacon and one of the founders of the First Baptist Church at Netherwood, Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York. According to the history of the church, he gave one hundred dollars toward its founding, and also boarded the carpenters while it was being built. He lived in the next house west of the church. He later bought a place four and one-half miles east of Poughkeepsie, and gave it to his daughter Ruth and her husband, Allan Shadbolt, where they lived the rest of their lives. Richard and Deborah also lived there in their later years.

James Hyatt was teacher of Sciences, in New York City. Egbert, second son of Sarah Welling and James Hyatt, b. in New York City, now living on farm at Stanfordville, New York which was bought by his great grandfather, Samuel Hyatt. Egbert has deed to farm, dated 1791. Has autographed dictionary belonging to Richard Lawrence. His mother, Sarah Welling, was reared by Ruth and Allan Shadbolt. Egbert possesses many family records regarding Jacob and Richard.

ROBERT LAWRENCE

Robert Lawrence (Richard² Jacob¹), b. October 9, 1785, d. March 24, 1837. Buried in Baptist Churchyard at Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York. Married Marcia Dodge, daughter of the Reverend John Dodge and Keziah Newcomb¹. Marcia Dodge Lawrence b. August 16, 1790 in Pleasant Valley and d. September 11, 1864 at Peru, Illinois.

Robert Lawrence was a town supervisor in 1833 and 1834.²

ROBERT LAWRENCE FUNERAL TUESDAY

Had Been Undertaker At Pleasant Valley For 30 Years

Funeral services will be held at the Pleasant Valley Presbyterian Church at 2:30 o'clock daylight saving time, Tuesday afternoon for Robert Doge Lawrence, 71, undertaker at Pleasant Valley for 30 years, who died at his home Saturday morning after a short illness. Friends of the family will be bearers and burial will be in the family plot at Clinton Corners Cemetery.

Mr. Lawrence was a deacon of the Pleasant Valley Presbyterian Church and a member of Pleasant Valley Grange No. 838, and Shekomeko Lodge, No. 458, F. & A. M.

Surviving Mr. Lawrence are his wife who was formerly Emma F. Wildey; one son, Herbert C. Lawrence of Pleasant Valley; two daughters, Mrs. Frank Stoutenburgh of Pleasant Valley and Mrs. Albert Mastin of Millbrook; and five brothers, Walter, Edwin, Virgil and Henry Lawrence, all of Poughkeepsie and John D. Lawrence of Stouchsburg, Pa.

JOHN DODGE LAWRENCE

John Dodge Lawrence (Robert³ Richard² Jacob¹), b. September 24, 1823 d. September 18, 1854 at Peru, Illinois. He married Carolyn Elizabeth Odell, the sixth child of a family of ten, daughter of Samuel Odell, a descendant of the French family dating back to 735. The first of the Odell family to come to this country was William Odell who came in 1689 to Concord, Massachusetts. He came from Odell, near London, and is a descendant of the French Odell, formerly spelled 'Wudell or Wodell.'

WILLIAM DODGE LAWRENCE*

William Dodge Lawrence (John Dodge⁴ Robert³ Richard² Jacob¹), b. May 11, 1853 at Peru, Illinois. M. Inez Mae Gill August 6, 1878 at Normal, Illinois. She was born November 14, 1858 at Champagne County, Illinois, and died November 27, 1922 at 1122 Washington Street, Lincoln, Nebraska. Inez Mae Gill was the daughter of David Gill, who died of congestive chills on December 30, 1852 at the Army Hospital on Yazoo River, Mississippi. David Gill was then thirty-two years old. He was an officer in the Civil War and lived at Friends Creek, Mason County, Illinois. David Gill and Ellen Cornell were married December 30, 1852 at Marion, Ohio.

William Dodge Lawrence chose as his profession that of a contractor. He built many of the early buildings in Lincoln, such as the Lincoln Carnegie Library, the Y. M. C. A. (old one), the Y. W. C. A. (new one), Wahoo County Court House, Beatrice Creamery Building.

Paul William Lawrence (William Dodge⁵ John Dodge² Robert³ Richard² Jacob¹), b. July 25, 1894, at Lincoln, Nebraska. Married October 25, 1921. Gladys Bernice Wilkinson, daughter of Richard Wilkinson and Sarah Rees Wilkinson, of Lincoln, Nebraska. (Re: Wilkinson History.)

Paul William Lawrence was educated at the "C" Street School, Lincoln High School, Iowa State College. Ames, Iowa, Harvard University. Was commissioned as an Ensign at the first officer's training camp at Harvard University in 1917. He served overseas until March 1919. Member of American Legion, Blue Lodge of the Masonic Order, Los Angeles Kiwanis Club, Sons of the Revolution, Society of Colonial Wars, Theta Sigma Fraternity, Casa Del Mar, Jonathan Club, Military Order of Foreign Wars, President of "The Paul Lawrence Glass Company." 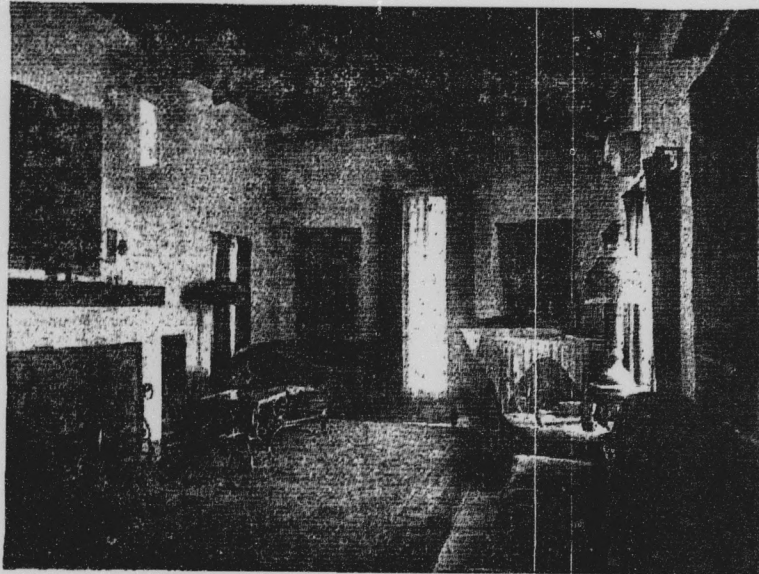
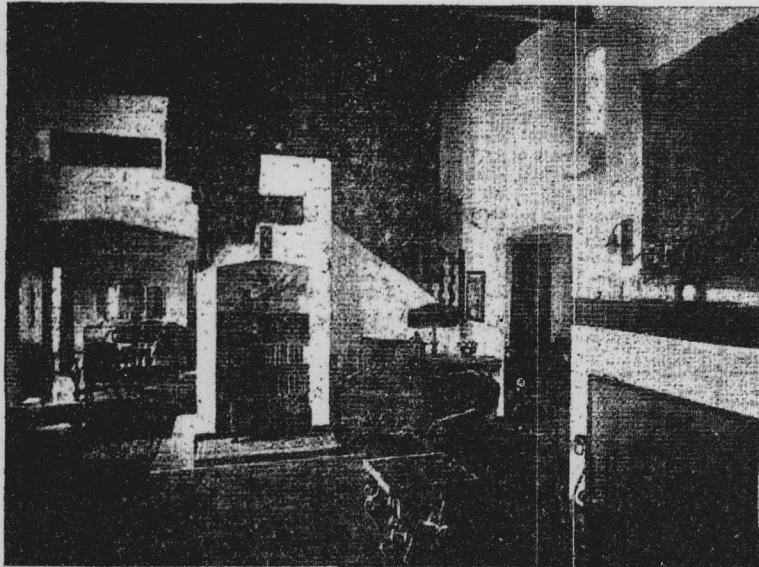

Note: Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence lived in Des Moines, Iowa from October, 1921 to December, 1922, where Mr. Lawrence was the manager of the Store Front Department of the Standard Glass and Paint Company. He later became manager of the Burlington, Iowa Store Front Department branch of the Murre Mirror Plate Company, and they lived in Burlington until February, 1923. At that time he was transferred to Bloomington, Indiana where the executive offices of the Murre Companies were located and became general manager of his department. He supervised the establishment of the St. Louis, Chattanooga and Kansas City branches of the company. He moved to California in January, 1925, where he founded his own company.
